RESULT: BROWARD CHILDREN AND YOUTH WITH CO-OCCURRING SPECIAL NEEDS AND MENTAL HEALTH NEEDS AND THEIR FAMILIES SUCCEED IN SCHOOL AND LIFE.

STORY BEHIND THE CURVE:

- Lack of services/resources that focus on populations with co-occurring SN/MH
- There is little to none blended/braided funding for persons with co-occurring SN/MH
- APD is funder of last resort and will not fund EBD until all other options have been exhausted
- Youth with Autism cannot get services for co-occurring SN/MH
- Difficult to get counseling funded for youth with DD
- Need trauma informed care for youth with anxiety and depression who also have developmental disabilities

- Data Subcommittee- 2-1-1, CMS, BCPS, FND
- Identify youth
- Shaped Needs & Assessment Data
- Service System Analysis- Gaps, Resources, Opportunities
- Awareness of community services that address co-occurring SN/MH
- Access to services for youth with co-occurring SN/MH
- Advocacy to prevent families from having to choose between funding for APD or EBD services.
- Parent support, rather than parent training
- Trauma informed training for parents
- Increased parent engagement
