Result: Broward County teens will be healthy. Indicators:


- arcators.

 - The rates of STDs/STIs for teens will decrease
 - High school graduation rates of teen parents will increase

What do we know and the story behind the data:


• The teen birth rate has been decreasing over time, as has the racial and ethnic disparity rates for teen births in Broward County


However...


- The rate of repeat teen births for 15-19 year olds, while experiencing a declining trend has recently increased again.
- The rate of repeat teen births for 15-17 year olds has also increased.
- While the increases for 15-19 year olds were across all ethnic and racial categories, for teens aged 15-17 it appears the largest increase was to Black, non-Hispanic women. However, for teens aged 18-19 it appears the largest increase was to White, non-Hispanic women.

























Data Development Agenda:

- Teen pregnancy statistics within Broward Schools compared to Broward County
- Review of statistics of zip codes and schools to determine where to target interventions for prevention and education
- Graduation rates for teen parents

Accomplishments:

- Teen Parent Alliance meets every other month with provider organizations, with the School Board of Broward County and DOH-Broward as lead agencies
- Speakers have been invited to the Teen Parent Alliance meeting, including 2-1-1 Broward, Legal Aid, HEART, Dating Matters, Drowning Prevention and Child Safety, Broward>AIDS, Statutory Rape laws, Flipping the Script, Mary's Pregnancy Resource Center, Filial Therapy
- Held Walk Aware events annually-over 500 students participate to promote positive youth outcomes
- New Sexual Health Diversity Program in Broward County Schools
- Conducted outreach to faith-based organizations



Challenges:

- Group does not meet monthly and does not meet over the summer; difficult to maintain momentum
- Data not easily accessible

Best Practices/What Works/Low-Cost/No-Cost/Off the Wall Ideas:

- Education and outreach
- Development of positive self-esteem and emotional health
- Increasing knowledge of sexual health
- Increasing perception of risk when having unprotected sex with regards to pregnancy and STI's
- Teens having reliable resources to guide them
